Pearl (Victoria) Hamilton Mazyck, ascended to her heavenly home on Sunday, February 20, 2022, in Mt. Pleasant, SC. She was born January 2, 1940, to Victoria McBride as one of 7 children: Clifford (“Taffy”) Hamilton, Marion (“Boot”) Hamilton, Lawrence (“Cigar”) Hamilton, Lee (“Maddie”) Hamilton, Nathan (“Killer”) Hamilton, and Blanche Hamilton. Pearl was educated in the Charleston County public school systems where she graduated from Laing High School. She then furthered her education by attending 2 years at Rice Business College in Charleston, SC.

Pearl dedicated her life to Christ at an early age and was a faithful member of Friendship A.M.E. Church. During her earthly years, she was a devoted servant of God, Mother, Grandmother, Great-Grandmother, community servant, and a loyal worker of Wild Dunes, on the Isle of Palms, for thirty-one years. Her service to God included serving for many, many years as an usher, church class leader, head of the January Calendar group, putting on a play to raise money for the church, being a faithful tither per the Word of God, and participating and extending her help to many who needed or called upon her at any time, day or night.

Pearl married the late Edward Mazyck, III where she enjoyed a happy and loving marriage. Pearl lived a busy life, one in which she enjoyed doing many firsts: She was the first female black poll manager for Mt. Pleasant, the first black dispatcher for Mt. Pleasant Police and Fire Department, S.C.; first black woman to run for Town Council in Mt. Pleasant. She enjoyed writing articles for The Chronicle, a newspaper published in Charleston, SC., She wrote and directed the play “The Devil has a change of heart” which became a fundraiser for her church, and On March 5, 2020, 124 Democrats and Republicans introduced and adopted A HOUSE
